What is P-TECH?

Pathways in Technology Early College High Schools



Students can work towards an **associates degree** and/or **industry certification**.



Gain hands-on work experience while in High School





How is P-TECH Different?

The P-TECH model offers a career focused education, including work-based learning opportunities with local businesses and corporate partners.

What is work-based learning?

Work based learning (WBL) is an educational strategy that provides students with real life work experiences where they can apply academic and technical skills learned in the classroom while developing their employability.







Work-Based Learning Experience



Guest Speakers

A group of students listen to a presentation to learn about the speaker's organization, careers and industry and ask questions to help them consider whether they might like to pursue an opportunity in the industry.



Industry Tours

Small groups of students visit a workplace, learn about the business, meet employees, ask questions and observe work in progress.



Career Workshops

Students have the opportunity to learn from a company professional about a specific subject related to their program.



Career Mentoring

The student is matched one-on-one or in small groups with an adult professional to explore potential careers and related educational issues.


